1 Design using Lettering

Design a logo for a company which organizes rambling, hiking, riding and climbing activities. The name of the company, **TREK**, must be included in your design. In addition show how the logo might look on a T-shirt **or** a hat.

2 Illustration and Calligraphy

Either (a) Design the cover of a nature book entitled **SHORESIDE**, published by a company named **Discovery**. Use your own name as the author.

Or (b) Using a calligraphic script with which you are familiar, write out the following verse and add a decorative border and/or an illustration.

I must down to the seas again, to the lonely sea and the sky,
And all I ask is a tall ship and a star to steer her by,
And the wheel's kick and the wind's song and the white sail's shaking,
And a grey mist on the sea's face and a grey dawn breaking.

3 Environmental/Structural Design

From research of the forms and shapes of the sails, masts and rigging of yachts, design a fountain to be sited on the quayside of a marina. Show in a ground plan the placing of seating and plants in containers in the immediate area and include an artist's impression of the fountain seen from the sea or river.

4 Interior Design

Design a horizontal mural, to the proportion of 5:2, for a café named after one of the following civilizations:

(a) The Aztec

(b) The Byzantine

(c) The Mughal

5 Fashion Design

Design a costume for a performer in a production entitled 'Night Creatures'.

6 Fabric Design

Design a repeat pattern for a headscarf **or** a necktie based on observations of knots or bows in ribbons, laces, straps or ropes.

7 Printmaking

Make a print or a series of prints to illustrate the cover of a text book, based on **one** of the following subjects:

- (a) History
- (b) Music
- (c) Biology

8 Photography

The curator of an exhibition requires images that celebrate the lives and customs of the people of your region, based on **one** of the following themes:

- (a) In the workplace
- (b) Children at play
- (c) Family celebration

You must process and print your own photographs

One main and two supporting photographs should be submitted. All three studies may be mounted on one side of thin card not exceeding A2 in size. Alternatively, they may be contained in a clear plastic cover. Contact prints of negatives or original digital images showing other possible angles and views must be included as part of the accompanying supporting work.
